


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WELCOME TO BURNET COUNTY 4-H

How Do You Enroll?

Head over to 4-HOnline (https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in) or (https://texas.4honline.com) and start the registration process. If you are enrolling a third grader, please wait until September 1 to enroll for proper fees to be accessed. If you are a RETURNING family, please make sure to read the steps for a returning 4-H member.

What's the Cost?

Youth Membership Fees

August 15 - October 31st | \$25.00 November 1 - Completiton of 4-H year | \$30.00 *all adult volunteers must register and have a background check completed.

Adult Membership Fees

August 15 - Completion of 4-H Year | \$10.00

New 4-H Family

Step 1

Select to set-up up a profile. Set-up ONLY ONE family profile per household.

Enter a valid e-mail address that is checked often.

Create a password. Requirements will be displayed on the screen if not validated.

Complete all family information.

Step 2

Start adding a member. Enter one enrollment profile at a time.

Youth will select at least one club and one project. Adults will seľecť a volunteer type.

Enter information in all fields on the "Questions Screen". Youth Birthdate and school grade determines eligibility.

Complete the Health and Consent Screens.

Step 3

Review fees. Youth fees vary with date enrolled.

Youth fees: \$25 until October 31st Adult fees: \$10

Add and select a credit card to pay for fees. Do not select "pay by county check

Select payment and agree to payment and refund terms.

Step 4

Youth

Review enrollment and fees. Click back to make corrections. Click submit.

Status changes to pending. County office will review and approve.

Payment is locked-in. Credit card is charged.

Status changes to approved.

Adult

Review enrollment and fees. Click back to make corrections. Click submit.

Adult volunteers must complete screening and required trainings.

Status changes to pending. Payment is locked in. Credit card is charged.

Status changes to approved after payment is received screening approved, and trainings completed.

Returning 4-H Family

Step 1

DO NOT create a new family profile.

Login with the family email address and password.

If you forgot your password, click "reset password link" or contact the extension off.

> Review and update family information.

Step 2

Click enroll next to the member's name.

You can only enroll one member át a time.

Continue through each screen to update. You MUST update school, grade, clubs and projects.

Complete the Health and Consent Screens.

Step 3

Review fees. Youth fees vary with date enrolled.

Youth fees: \$25 until October 31st Adult fees: \$10

Add and select a credit card to pay for fees. Do not select "pay by county check

Select payment and agree to payment and refund terms.

Step 4

Youth

Review enrollment and fees. Click back to make corrections. Click submit.

We Love Volunteers!

We love volunteers in our 4-H program! In fact... we NEED them! With 40+ different projects in this program that are incredibly diverse - we can't do it all without you! Serving as a Burnet County 4-H Adult Volunteer can be anything you want/need it to be - from assisting at the local club level with club communications, fundraising, or meeting planning, to assisting in a bigger role such as a project leader or team coach!

Is That Me?

If you are serving as an adult volunteer in any capacity (being more than just a parent to your child), we ask that you become a screened and approved volunteer. This not only protects our youth, but it protects you under Texas 4-H as well!

What's the Process?

- You will enroll as a volunteer through 4-H Online (under the same Family Profile if you have 4-H members enrolled). Refer to the "How To Enroll" page for step-by-step instructions.
- You must be 18 years of age (21 to chaperone overnight trips) to serve as an adult volunteer.
- As part of your enrollment process- all adult volunteers must complete the screening process (background check), and the required trainings. Once both of those are completed and you are cleared, you will be an approved 4-H adult volunteer!
- Volunteers will have a \$10 fee associated with their enrollment.

Burnet County 4-H Volunteer Examples:

Serving as a volunteer for our program can be whatever you want it to be! Maybe you're an expert in a certain project area and can serve as a coach, or maybe you're really good at organizing fundraisers! Whatever your strengths are- there's a place for you here! Some examples of how our volunteers are currently serving Burnet County 4-H: Livestock Judging Coach, Wool Judging Coach, Consumer Decision Making Coach, Meats Judging Coach, Club Managers, Program Area Committee members, event and contests judges, etc.

Each 4-H member is encouraged to keep a record of his or her 4-H work. Records are not an extra task, but a part of the learning experience! By your 4-her recording their activities they can keep track of all the different learning experiences, they have had in the 4-H program. Record Books are open to all age divisions (junior, intermediate, and senior age divisions).

Through 4-H Record Books, your 4-her will learn how to set goals, keep track of tasks/awards/contests, and reflect on what they learned throughout the year.

Record Books are also a great way to see your 4-Hers growth over their 4-H career! Also, this process is extremely helpful when it comes to applying for scholarships!!

Applications are typically released in February, and due in April.

TEEA Scholarship

Scholarships will be awarded to graduating high school senior 4-Hers who have been a member in good standing with the County 4-H program *for the last 4 years*. Scholarship selection will consist of leadership and personal development through 4-H; community and school participation and the student's desire to continue their education by attending an accredited institution of higher learning. Please know that a completed 4-H Record Book is required as part of the application (from the applicants Junior year).

Applications are due February 1st.
